On the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women, take to the streets and demand justice for rape survivors, freedom from harassment, and an end to all forms of male violence. Join Reclaim the Night 2017!

WHY RECLAIM THE NIGHT?

- Nearly 1 in 3 women in the UK will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime
- Every year around 400,000 women are sexually assaulted and 80,000 women are raped
- Around 66,000 women are living with FGM in England & Wales, and 20,000 girls are at risk
- 79% of women aged 18-24 recently reported that sexual harassment was 'the norm' on nights out.
- Two women are murdered by their partners or ex-partners every week

Reclaim The Night remains as relevant now as it did in 1977 when the first marches took place in the UK. Wear something red (if you can) to mark 40 years of women's activism and resistance and get ready to make some noise!

The women only march will be followed by a rally and after party which is open to all at the Camden Centre, on Euston Road. There will be speakers, performers, food, a licenced bar and DJs. Due to licencing requirements at the Camden Centre, u18s must be accompanied by a parent/guardian in the Camden Centre and may be required to leave the premises following the rally.
